Well I have just returned from Ecuador and our team experienced a great trip. You may have received a short newsletter just last week asking you to be in prayer for the team. Well, we could tell many had been praying. The Lord truly blessed as we had the opportunity to see over 700 Quechua Indians give their lives to Jesus.

The Churches that took part in this trip were from the Dallas Texas area, which included, First Baptist Prosper, Living Water, Collin Creek, Duncanville Cowboy and First Baptist Church of Cleveland Texas which is close to Houston Texas. The team experienced some very special times as we had the opportunity to minister in the city of Reombamba on a couple of occasions. This was not planned but a couple of days we finished early out in the mountains and had some great times in the city leading many to Jesus including many street children, police officers, and vendors.

We also had the opportunity to see the Ecuadorian military band play as they accompanied us into the mountains one day. The entire military band made up of 30 men gave their lives to Jesus. It was an awesome week. The next Happy Feet trip will be the last one of the year. I will be taking an EXTREME TEAM to Costa Rica to work on the Colorado River that separates Costa Rica and Nicaragua October 23-30. It sounds like we will be camping out closer to the Nicaragua side and will be there working among the people that live in villages on the river bank.

This is an awesome trip to say the very least. Last year we encountered wild life that most people only see on TV. The people that live in this area are very receptive of the Gospel. So, begin praying now for the team of men - pray for our safety, and that many will be saved. You will receive another newsletter before this last trip just as a reminder.

Lastly, the 2011 year is shaping up. There are eight teams on the new calendar and another eight searching for a week to schedule. It looks like it will be a very busy new year.
